Grange View C E First School - Pupil Premium Report 2012/13

School is allocated, by the government, a sum of money each year to address the current underlying inequalities between children eligible for free school meals and their wealthier peers. In the 2012/13 Financial Year (based on the January 2012 census) this amount was £623 for each child eligible for Free School Meals (FSM) or in the care of the local authority (LAC) with an additional £200 for each child with a parent in the Armed Services.

At Grange View C E First School this sum came to £12460.

16 pupils attract Pupil Premium Payments, 16 % of pupils currently on roll. 20 pupils total eligible for Deprivation Pupil Premium

Pupil premium 2012-13: £623 per pupil + Deprivation allocation = 12460

7 pupils receive subsidised swimming costs-£340

16 pupils subsidised educational visits x 3 per year - £480

16 pupils After school club costs x 6 terms - £580

RWI Training Resources-£660

TA hours supporting interventions across school-£6300 Nursery/KS1 TA (\pm 4085 Intervention hours)-£10401

Schools are free to spend the Pupil Premium as they see fit, but are accountable for the success of their chosen expenditure.

In the 2011/12 academic year 67% Y1 pupils at the school eligible for Free School Meals achieved the expected standard in the Phonics Screening Check compared to 58% nationally.

The overall attainment gap (Reading, Writing and Maths) based on Average Point Scores at the end of KS1 between FSM and non FSM pupils was below the gap identified nationally.

The number of FSM pupils leaving Y4 in 2012 achieving 1 level of progress or better from the end of KS1 is above that of their non FSM peers in Reading , Writing and Maths.

APS measures show this group of children performing better in reading, writing and maths than the LA average.

Impact 2012/13:

Year 1 (13 children) -Phonics Test -77% of children passed the test- this is higher than National average of 69%

- 100% of girls passed the test, 63% of boys
- 100% of FSM children passed (2 children) and 73% of Non FSM children passed
- 33% of SEN children passed (3 children)

From Year 2 to Year 4 children have made 9.4APS in reading, 8.4APS in Writing and 8.9APS in Maths. This shows good progress and results are higher than county average. FSM children results show good progress.
