CORONAVIRUS UPDATE

As a school we are continuing to following all the guidance and advice being given by Public Health England and the local authority in relation to the coronavirus.

All children have taken part in their classrooms in sessions to raise awareness of personal hygiene. To support good handwashing we are singing 'Happy Birthday' (twice) which has been recommended so that they are handwashing for 20 seconds. The staff continue to carry hand sanitiser, every class has hand sanitiser and plenty of tissues. All pupils are reminded and encouraged to wash their hands at every opportunity. Our caretaker and cleaner are deep cleaning daily by wiping handles, doors, door frames and desks daily as well as their normal cleaning. Please ensure you see and read all the updates we post and send out.

You should not be unduly worried about the possibility of your children catching the Coronavirus.

There is no reason why your children should not continue to attend their early years, school or further education setting as normal.

What action you can take-

A UK wide campaign has been launched to provide clear advice on how to slow the spread of Coronavirus. Please help to support the campaign which promotes basic hygiene practices, such as regularly washing hands and always sneezing into a tissue, to stem the spread of viruses.

SATS DATES AND HOLIDAYS

The summer term is fast approaching and during this term the children in many classes complete a range of statutorynational tests and assessments. In Y1, the children complete a Phonics Screening Check, in Y2 it's SATs tests and teacher assessments in reading, writing and maths and in Y4 it's the new Multiplication Tables Check It is very important that the children do the very best they possibly can in these assessments as the data from them is likely to be used to help measure the progress that they make in future years. The information we gain from these is also vital in helping to ensure that we provide what is needed for each child. Children who miss the vital weeks at school leading up to these assessments are put at a disadvantage. Although we have a small window of opportunity to allow children who have missed tests to complete then, this often means the child completing them alone—this also increases staff workload and takes away from other pupils. ALTHOUGH WE DO NOT AUTHORISE HOLIDAYS DURING TERM TIME ANYWAY - PLEASE AVOID BOOKING HOLIDAYS DURING THESE TIMES IN PARTICULAR.

Mobile Phones on school site

Please can we ask that we respect our children inside and outside of the school building. Please do not use your phone for any purposes when in the school hall for safeguarding purposes, anyone seen by staff will be asked to turn their phone off.

When collecting your child please remember they are looking forward to you picking them up and want to talk about their school *day*, so pop your phone away and find out what they have been learning about.

First Aid Treatment

All our staff are first aid trained and if your child receives a bump to their head depending on the nature they will receive treatment plus a sticker and a note to let you know what has happened. Any other first aid treatment is dealt with accordingly and information is recorded on our CPOMS secure online system as a record of any accidents.

PE Kit

Children are missing out on valuable PE lessons due to not having the correct kit in school – kit does not include football kit. PE kit is school PE top, black shorts and sandshoes. There is no spare PE kit in school so please make sure your child has his/her kit in at all times. Pupils reports will be changing this year and will include information about PE kit, Attendance and homework commitment.

Please make sure your child has pierced ears covered for all PE lessons or have ear-rings removed.

Cold weather

Please remember to stay on the gritted pathways around school on all cold icy mornings to avoid any slipping and sliding. Our Caretaker Mr Guy is on site early making sure each pathway on the Gritting plan has been salted.

Inclement weather

During these cold and rainy mornings the school doors will open at 8.45am at the earliest, so we encourage you to arrive on the yard just before 8.50am for the bell which rings at 8.50am. If you arrive early you may get wet and cold! Children will be escorted into school as usual by the class teacher, so please don't try to come into school early as your child will not be supervised.

NUT ALLERGIES IN PACKED LUNCHES

We have still have a child in school with nut allergies therefore for the safety of the child but this week some parents are who are not checking. Mrs Laskey has found Kinder bars, hazelnut croissants, nutella sandwiches etc.

All nut based biscuits, bars, spreads etc in our school are banned. This includes chocolate spreads that are nut based and any other bakes and pastries eg. Pain au chocolate, crepes, nutty biscuits etc. So sorry for any inconvenience but this is essential for the well-being of all our children. Thank you.

Reading

It is essential you try and read with your child every day and record in their book if you have please. In some cases parents are not support their child with this and it impacts on their learning and progress. Please help us with your child's learning by hearing them read at least **3 TIMES PER WEEK,** thank you.

Tips for reading with children of any age:

- Set aside some time
- Find somewhere quiet without any distractions turn off the TV/radio/computer.
- Ask your child to choose a book
- Sharing books they have chosen shows you care what they think and that their opinion matters. This means they are more likely to engage with the book.
- Sit close together
- Encourage your child to hold the book themselves and/or turn the pages.
- Point to the pictures















- If there are illustrations, relate them to something your child knows. Ask them to describe
 the characters or situation or what will happen next. Encourage them to tell you the story
 by looking at the pictures.
- Encourage your child to talk about the book
- Talking about the characters and their dilemmas helps children understand relationships and is an excellent way for you to get to know each other or discuss difficult issues. Give your child plenty of time to respond. Ask them what will happen next, how a character might be feeling or how the book makes them feel.
- And lastly, above all make it fun!

It doesn't matter how you read with a child, as long as you both enjoy the time together.

Don't be afraid to use funny voices - children love this! It's never too early to start reading with your baby too.

FREE SCHOOL MEALS (PUPIL PREMIUM)

Some parents/carers whose income is below £16,190 per family are entitled to Free School Meals (OFSTED call this pupil premium). The school currently receives additional funding per pupil in our budget to use to support these pupils across the school. We use it to benefit every child by supporting us to have extra staff for small group work, buy resources to support small group work and interventions. A small proportion of this funding is used to subsidise Breakfast and Afterschool clubs and support half the cost of residential and school visits. The information is fully available on the school website for everyone to read.

Punctuality

Pupils are recorded as being late for school if they arrive after the doors have closed and come in through the main school doors. All Doors will be locked once classes are inside and the main entrance will have to be used.

IF YOU ARE RUNNING LATE FOR ANY REASON OR YOUR CHILD IS NOT COMING INTO SCHOOL DUE TO SICKNESS OR OTHER CIRCUMSTANCES, PLEASE RING TO LET US KNOW, THANK YOU.

All late marks show on children's attendance registers and we will be routinely contacting parents whose children are regularly late. Our routines start the minute children arrive at school with children getting straight on with their independent work in class. Children arriving late miss out on vital learning time and find it harder to settle into the school day and some pupils get upset when they are constantly late. Please help us by ensuring your child is at school, ready to come in when the bell rings at 8.50am. We'll keep you posted on how we are doing in our assemblies and newsletter.

<u>Attendance</u>

PLEASE NOTE THE INCREASE TO 94% attendance for any child taken out of school for a holiday in term time. This is the minimum they must have if parents do not want to be issued a penalty notice unless there are exceptional circumstances.

All schools in the Coquet Partnership have agreed that if an unauthorised leave of absence is taken during term time and the pupil's attendance in the 12 month period leading up to the absence is less than 94%, an application to the Local Authority for a penalty notice may be made based on the circumstances. Our overall whole school attendance target is 97%.

Ofsted Attendance

To aim to an outstanding school Ofsted say- 'Pupils value their education and rarely miss a day at school. No groups of pupils are disadvantaged by low attendance. The attendance of pupils who have previously had exceptionally high rates of absence is rising quickly towards the national average'.

Grange View needs every pupil at school every day to improve our overall attendance please

Safe to Learn section

Headteacher

This is a section on our newsletter where we will share and update any safeguarding information for all parents/carers to be aware of. Mrs Pat Treanor is our Chair of governors and Safeguarding governor, Mrs Laskey and Mrs Chapman are our Designated Safeguarding lead staff.

OPERATION ENCOMPASS INFORMATION

The original initiative was aimed at supporting children who are affected by domestic abuse. The next part of the project will help all children to learn about friendships, relationships, emotions and rules so that they can live and work together safely. Our Safeguarding liaison officer Karen Kirkbride will be in school this term delivering these workshops.

<u>Operation Endeavour</u>- This is an innovative project in which schools and colleges in Northumberland are participating, and which is run in partnership with Northumberland County Council and Northumbria Police. Operation Endeavour which commences in November 2018, aims to support children and young people who go missing from home. Children who go missing from home are at risk of significant harm and they may be vulnerable to sexual exploitation, violent crime, gang exploitation, or to drug and alcohol misuse. As a result, following any report of a child going missing to the Police, the Police will make contact with Children's Social Care who will then communicate relevant and necessary information to nominated school staff.

Each school has members of staff (key adults) who have been fully trained in liaising with the Police and Children's Social Care when required, and will ensure that the necessary support is made available to the child or young person following their return.

I believe that this project demonstrates our school's commitment to working in partnership to safeguard and protect children, and to providing the best possible care and support for our pupils.
