Curriculum Topic reviews

EYFS- Minibeasts

Early Years have had a jam packed half term looking at different minibeasts. We have been reading our favourite Minibeast stories such as The Very Hungry Caterpillar, Mad about Minibeasts, Sharing a Shell and The Bad Tempered Ladybird. We have used our puppets to act out the stories.

We learnt all about the life cycle of a butterfly. We had our very own pet caterpillars and we watched them grow, make a cocoon and turn into beautiful butterflies. We had so much fun watching them grow for weeks and then releasing them into the wild. We also learnt the parts of a plant and planted our own sunflowers. We know all the elements needed to make a plant grow and we have enjoyed watering them each day. In Art we learnt all about the artist Henri Mattise and how he uses collage materials. We then created our own Matisse snails from collage. We also learnt the song 'A tiny Caterpillar on a leaf' and created our own musical instruments to play along with the song.

Our forest school area has been great for our many bug hunts and seeing what minibeasts we can find. We have also used the pond to look at life cycles of a frog.

We are looking forward to more learning next half term.

Elm and Beech Class Summary - All Creatures Great and Small

Despite this term being short it has been very busy and jam packed. In science we have continuing on from their learning about food chains last term and considering different animal groups and their habitats. Our outdoor area has been great for investigating pond and woodland habitats and learning all about amphibians., fish, birds and insects.

KS1 enjoyed their visit to Boulmer Beach to embed their understanding of rock pool and coastal habitats and it is safe to say the arrival of the living eggs was certainly a massive highlight, specially seeing them hatch and grow to be so big before they returned to the farm. Likewise, seeing the lifecycle of a frog in the pond and a caterpillar in our butterfly garden was a great experience.

In Geography they have been learning about human and physical features, drawing plans of our local area and using a key to identify roads, the school and other features. They then contrasted this to Cameroon, a jungle habitat which was a great reinforcement of their equator and continents work last term.

Additionally, this term we have been learning about a different world religion, Hinduism, the children have been fascinated with the different Gods and their features. We are looking forward to learning more next term and comparing to Christianity.

KS2- Willow– Inside Out

Although it has only been a short half term, we seemed to have packed a huge amount of work and activities in! This half term has been very science based, as our topic was called Inside Out and we focused on the inside of our bodies. We have been learning the names and functions of the digestive system, teeth and blood. The children were really interested in this whole topic and had lots of great questions throughout. We completed a very messy investigation where we used a pair of tights as an intestine and passed some mashed up food through it to see how it works inside of us! We also did some excellent writing about teeth from our learning in class.

We also managed to squeeze in three amazing trips out this half term! First, we joined in with a hula hooping festival with several other schools and became experts with all the hula hooping skills and tricks they taught us. Then competed in the Tri Golf competition against five other schools and came first! We were so proud of how they performed and the team skills they were showing when supporting one another in each game. We finished off our half term with our amazing residential, which every child enjoyed and made amazing memories. It was a brilliant experience for everyone and we are super proud of how they did.

Also this half term, we have been learning about Judaism. We looked at their lifestyles, special artefacts and celebration days. We will continue looking at Judaism next half term with a focus on Abraham and his importance.








Safe to Learn section

OPERATION ENCOMPASS INFORMATION

The original initiative was aimed at supporting children who are affected by domestic abuse. The next part of the project will help all children to learn about friendships, relationships, emotions and rules so that they can live and work together safely.

<u>Operation Endeavour</u>- This is an innovative project in which schools and colleges in Northumberland are participating, and which is run in partnership with Northumberland County Council and Northumbria Police.

Operation Endeavour commenced in November 2018, aims to support children and young people who go missing from home. Children who go missing from home are at risk of significant harm and they may be vulnerable to sexual exploitation, violent crime, gang exploitation, or to drug and alcohol misuse.

As a result, following any report of a child going missing to the Police, the Police will make contact with Children's Social Care who will then communicate relevant and necessary information to nominated school staff.

Each school has members of staff (key adults) who have been fully trained in liaising with the Police and Children's Social Care when required, and will ensure that the necessary support is made available to the child or young person following their return.

I believe that this project demonstrates our school's commitment to working in partnership to safeguard and protect children, and to providing the best possible care and support for our pupils.
