SCHOOL LUNCHES

Due to the cost of living crisis Grange View will be keeping the cost of our school lunches at £2.20, despite being advised to increase the cost by the Local Authority. We understand that enough household bills are increasing at the moment, and we are keen to keep costs low. This will be monitored during the Autumn term to make sure we can continue to keep within our costs. Hopefully more children will make the move onto school lunches as the cost of making packed lunches at home continues to rise.

WATER BOTTLES

When we come back to school in September each child will receive a free water bottle with their name on, featuring the school logo. So please do not go out and buy one in the summer holidays. They can be kept in school and refilled daily.

THE READING CHALLENGE IS BACK!

The **Summer Reading Challenge** is an annual event aimed at 4 – 11-year-olds. CURRICULUM TOPIC REVIEWS

Early Years Topic Review - Beaches

Early Years have had a jam packed half term learning all about the Seaside. We have been reading our favourite summer stories such as Sharing a Shell, The Snail and the Whale, At The Seaside, The Troll and The Rainbow Fish. We have used our puppets to act out the stories. We looked at seaside towns in the past and compared them to what they are like now. We talked about our favourite activities at the beach. In Art we have created our own sea creatures from paper plates and made our own rainbow fish after reading the story. In the role play area we made a beach café and pretended we were at the beach. We loved using the pirates to act out some small world play too. We had an incredible visit to the Blue Reef Aquarium in Tynemouth. We looked all around the aquarium and spotted many different types of fish, turtles, eels, sting rays and even some sharks! We then watched the seal show, we loved their tricks. We also had a rockpool workshop and we got to handle the animals. It was such a fantastic day out. Our forest school area has been great for looking for signs of summer and comparing this to our winter walk.

KS1 Topic Review – Travellers' Tales

This has been a thoroughly enjoyable topic – the children started with a wonderful visit to Beamish, it was a fantastic trip and great opportunity for the children to embed their understanding of transport through time and make comparisons between different modes. They created some great writing as historians back in class as well as linking to their materials work earlier in the year when describing the changes and developments in transport. They did some great writing using the video stimulus Zahra as a story from another culture. Finally, they concluded by transforming a box into their chosen transport, practising lots of DT skills such as joining techniques, and adding wheels and axels.

KS2 Topic Review – Anglo-Saxons; Invaders or Settlers?

This half term has been very busy and jam-packed! Our topic has been very history based as we have learned all about who the Anglo-Saxon's were and where they came from. Children were very interested in this topic and have been inquisitive throughout with lots of questions and discussions. The learning has helped us to create some fantastic pieces of writing, including a newspaper report and a non-chronological report all about Anglo-Saxons. Children really enjoyed the art lessons within

this topic, particularly making an Anglo-Saxon brooch. In science, we have been focussing on plants and have learnt about what they need to survive. We have also learned about the different parts of a plant and their functions and the part that plants play in the process of pollination. We have used different investigations to explore these concepts. Year 4 have also squeezed in trips and have enjoyed days like Quad Kids and a Commonwealth Games day at Alnwick Gardens. We were very proud of how the children performed during these events and all showed great sportsmanship!

This term we have continued our learning about Judaism. We have explored different festivals celebrated by Jewish people and have looked at who Abraham was and why he is seen to be so important for many people.

LATENESS

The Governors are keen to improve attendance further as we end the summer term and look forward to a new academic year. From 27th June, for all those who are late (arriving after register closes at 9am) we have a signing in book we would like you to fill in explaining the reason for the lateness. This was recommended by the Education Welfare Officer (EWO) as good practise and something we hope to have embedded ready for September.








Safe to Learn section

OPERATION ENCOMPASS INFORMATION

The original initiative was aimed at supporting children who are affected by domestic abuse. The next part of the project will help all children to learn about friendships, relationships, emotions and rules so that they can live and work together safely.

<u>Operation Endeavour</u>- This is an innovative project in which schools and colleges in Northumberland are participating, and which is run in partnership with Northumberland County Council and Northumbria Police.

Operation Endeavour commenced in November 2018, aims to support children and young people who go missing from home. Children who go missing from home are at risk of significant harm and they may be vulnerable to sexual exploitation, violent crime, gang exploitation, or to drug and alcohol misuse.

As a result, following any report of a child going missing to the Police, the Police will make contact with Children's Social Care who will then communicate relevant and necessary information to nominated school staff.

Each school has members of staff (key adults) who have been fully trained in liaising with the Police and Children's Social Care when required, and will ensure that the necessary support is made available to the child or young person following their return.

I believe that this project demonstrates our school's commitment to working in partnership to safeguard and protect children, and to providing the best possible care and support for our pupils.
