### **HEADTEACHER'S MESSAGE**

Welcome back to everyone and we hope you have all had a wonderful summer holiday and spent quality time with your lovely children. Now it's back to school with lots of hard work and challenges ahead. We look forward to working with you all this year to help and support your child learning lots of new skills. Please support us with all we do.

### **THANK YOU**

Many thanks go to all of the parents and pupils for all your kind cards, flowers, chocolates, gifts, etc. We really are grateful for all your thoughtfulness and kindness.

### **NUT ALLERGIES**

**We have a child in school with nut allergies therefore for the safety of the child we are now banning any nut based biscuits, bars, spreads etc in our school. This includes chocolate spreads that are nut based and any other bakes and pastries eg. Pain au chocolate, crepes, nutty biscuits etc. So sorry for any inconvenience but this is essential for the well-being of all our children. Thank you.**

### **NEW EXITS**

Reception and Elm class will be leaving the school building via new exits at the end of the day. Reception(Oak) will leave the classroom via the back Nursery door. Elm Class will exit via the side door beside the outdoor play equipment. This is to avoid all classroom exits having any congestion and the staff seeing the parents of all the younger children being collected.

### **OUT of ORDER**

Please can all Nursery and Reception parents keep their children off the outdoor equipment around the side of the school. It was inspected yesterday and needs some repairs before we can use it again. So for health and safety reasons it MUST NOT be used. Thank you for your co-operation.

### **Wrap around childcare**

Up to now we have had a very small uptake on this provision. We would really like to continue this for the rest of this year but to make this viable we must have a minimum of 10 children using this provision. Please contact the school office to book and pay for places now for our wrap around care to ensure you get a space. 3.15-5.30pm (Mon-Thurs), and 3.15pm-5.15pm (Friday) - £3.50 for one hour or £6 for 2 hours and 15mins. Thank you.

### **Breakfast Club for Sept 19**

Places must be booked at the office on a MONDAY and the cost is £1 per session, 8.15- 8.55am and payment must be made when booking. No places will be available without prior payment please. Doors will open at 8.15am and close at 8.30am when a member of staff will be on duty.

### **Online Portal Opening September 2019 - Middle, High and Secondary**

The Online Portal for Admissions to Middle, High and Secondary Schools will Open in September 2019 for children transferring from First to Middle (current Year 4) – Middle to High (current Year 8) and Primary to Secondary (current Year 6). ### **Leave of Absence**

If your child is going to be absent for any reason, please remember you must inform the school office so this can be recorded in our attendance data base. All holiday requests must be applied for using the school's application form available from the school office, thank you.

### **Reading**

It is essential you try and read with your child every day and record in their book if you have please. In some cases parents are not support their child with this and it impacts on their learning and progress. Please help us with your child's learning by hearing them read at least **3 TIMES PER WEEK**, thank you.

**Tips for reading with children of any age:**

- **Set aside some time**
- **Find somewhere quiet without any distractions - turn off the TV/radio/computer.**
- **Ask your child to choose a book**
- **Sharing books they have chosen shows you care what they think and that their opinion matters. This means they are more likely to engage with the book.**
- **Sit close together**
- **Encourage your child to hold the book themselves and/or turn the pages.**
- **Point to the pictures**

- If there are illustrations, relate them to something your child knows. Ask them to describe the characters or situation or what will happen next. Encourage them to tell you the story by looking at the pictures.
- Encourage your child to talk about the book
- Talking about the characters and their dilemmas helps children understand relationships and is an excellent way for you to get to know each other or discuss difficult issues. Give your child plenty of time to respond. Ask them what will happen next, how a character might be feeling or how the book makes them feel.
- And lastly, above all - make it fun!

It doesn't matter how you read with a child, as long as you both enjoy the time together.

Don't be afraid to use funny voices - children love this! It's never too early to start reading with your baby too.

### **FREE SCHOOL MEALS (PUPIL PREMIUM)**

Some parents/carers whose income is below £16,190 per family are entitled to Free School Meals (OFSTED call this pupil premium). The school currently receives additional funding per pupil in our budget to use to support these pupils across the school. We use it to benefit every child by supporting us to have extra staff for small group work, buy resources to support small group work and interventions. A small proportion of this funding is used to subsidise Breakfast and Afterschool clubs and support half the cost of residential and school visits.

### **Punctuality**

Pupils are recorded as being late for school if they arrive after the doors have closed and come in through the main school doors. Children who arrive after 9am receive an unauthorised mark.

All Doors will be locked once classes are inside and the main entrance will have to be used.

**IF YOU ARE RUNNING LATE FOR ANY REASON OR YOUR CHILD IS NOT COMING INTO SCHOOL DUE TO SICKNESS OR OTHER CIRCUMSTANCES, PLEASE RING TO LET US KNOW, THANK YOU.**

All late marks show on children's attendance registers and we will be routinely contacting parents whose children are regularly late. Our routines start the minute children arrive at school with children getting straight on with their independent work in class. Children arriving late miss out on vital learning time and find it harder to settle into the school day and some pupils get upset when they are constantly late. Please help us by ensuring your child is at school, ready to come in when the bell rings at 8.50am. We'll keep you posted on how we are doing in our assemblies and newsletters.

### **Attendance**

All schools in the Coquet Partnership have agreed that if an unauthorised leave of absence is taken during term time and the pupil's attendance in the 12 month period leading up to the absence is less than 92%, an application to the Local Authority for a penalty notice will be made. **Our overall NEW school attendance target is 97%.**

### **Safe to Learn section**

This is a section on our newsletter where we will share and update any safeguarding information for all parents/carers to be aware of. Mrs Pat Treanor is our Chair of governors and Safeguarding governor, Mrs Laskey and Mrs Chapman are our Designated Safeguarding lead staff.

### **OPERATION ENCOMPASS INFORMATION**

The original initiative was aimed at supporting children who are affected by domestic abuse. The next part of the project will help all children to learn about friendships, relationships, emotions and rules so that they can live and work together safely. Our Safeguarding liaison officer Karen Kirkbride will be in school this term delivering these workshops.

**Operation Endeavour**- This is an innovative project in which schools and colleges in Northumberland are participating, and which is run in partnership with Northumberland County Council and Northumbria Police. Operation Endeavour which commences in November 2018, aims to support children and young people who go missing from home. Children who go missing from home are at risk of significant harm and they may be vulnerable to sexual exploitation, violent crime, gang exploitation, or to drug and alcohol misuse. As a result, following any report of a child going missing to the Police, the Police will make contact with Children's Social Care who will then communicate relevant and necessary information to nominated school staff.

Each school has members of staff (key adults) who have been fully trained in liaising with the Police and Children's Social Care when required, and will ensure that the necessary support is made available to the child or young person following their return.

I believe that this project demonstrates our school's commitment to working in partnership to safeguard and protect children, and to providing the best possible care and support for our pupils.
