TOPIC REVIEWS

Early Years

Autumn 1 Review – All About Me.

Early Years have settled in to school very well. We have spent lots of time building friendships and learning new routines. Our topic has been 'Ourselves. We have looked at a variety of stories, talked about our features, hobbies, interests and our families. We have used mirrors to draw self-portraits and created skeleton pictures. We have also been learning how to keep our bodies healthy and how we can keep our teeth clean. We enjoyed learning our harvest festival songs and learning the actions. We have talked about what Harvest means to us and explored autumn pumpkins.

Both Acorns and Oak have enjoyed having Little Movers as our PE lessons. We love learning new dances and playing games. Oak children have also had yoga sessions this half term. All of the children have loved our Dough Disco sessions to strengthen our fine motor skills. Oak class have started learning their Read Write Inc sounds. Acorns have started listening out for environmental sounds and instrumental sounds. We have enjoyed spending lots of time in our outdoor areas looking for signs of autumn and creating pictures with what we have found. We have had a fabulous half term.

KEY STAGE 1

Autumn 1 Review - Toys, toys, toys.

This half term the children have been learning all about toys. We looked at lots of toys that were popular in the past from the Bailiffgate museum and had a chance to look, play and compare them. We have thought carefully about the materials that toys were made from and even got to design our own.

Although we loved looking at the toys, a highlight of the half term was when we learned all about mechanisms and the children got to create their own pushes and levers following on from our science learning of pushes and pulls. We have some strong children in our class and loved exploring forces through everyday activities (and some not so every day like tug of war).

The children have really enjoyed this topic and have even been picking toy story books and fact books when visiting Cathy at the library.

















KEY STAGE 2

Autumn 1 Review - Courageous Castles

The children thoroughly enjoyed the topic at the start of this school year, it kicked off with a great visit to Alnwick Castle where the children acted out storming/ guarding the Barbican, went on a historical tour of the castle grounds, asked questions first hand to learn about living in the castle during their staterooms tour and had great fun dressing up as knights and ladies in the Knights Quest.

Another thoroughly enjoyable activity has been the Year 4s learning the ukuleles with our expert from the music tuition program, something the Year 3s are looking forward to later in the year.

A surprisingly popular event was our study of imaginary and fantasy stories when all the children became immersed in how to train your dragon, their creative writing throughout the term has been very imaginative and enjoyable to read.

Our new small steps progression for English has created some wonderful instructional and persuasive letter writing. The term has been action packed celebrating Greek Day, performing their lines brilliantly for the Harvest Festival and all the children fiercely competing for roles in the Christmas play - what a wonderful term Willow and Chestnut!



OPERATION ENCOMPASS INFORMATION

The original initiative was aimed at supporting children who are affected by domestic abuse. The next part of the project will help all children to learn about friendships, relationships, emotions and rules so that they can live and work together safely.

<u>Operation Endeavour</u>- This is an innovative project in which schools and colleges in Northumberland are participating, and which is run in partnership with Northumberland County Council and Northumbria Police.

Operation Endeavour commenced in November 2018, aims to support children and young people who go missing from home. Children who go missing from home are at risk of significant harm and they may be vulnerable to sexual exploitation, violent crime, gang exploitation, or to drug and alcohol misuse.

As a result, following any report of a child going missing to the Police, the Police will make contact with Children's Social Care who will then communicate relevant and necessary information to nominated school staff.

Each school has members of staff (key adults) who have been fully trained in liaising with the Police and Children's Social Care when required, and will ensure that the necessary support is made available to the child or young person following their return.

I believe that this project demonstrates our school's commitment to working in partnership to safeguard and protect children, and to providing the best possible care and support for our pupils.
