TOPIC REVIEWS

Early Years

Autumn 2 Review - Festivals

Our topic this half term has been festivals and celebrations. We have enjoyed learning about bonfire night; creating our own firework artwork and chocolate sparklers. We have also learnt all about the festival of Diwali and used clay to make our own Diya lamps. We then painted them and added glitter. We all created poppies for Remembrance Day and learnt all about Sikhism for Interfaith Week. We also talked about our birthdays and looked at how we celebrate our special days. We commented on how we have all changed since we were babies.

We have enjoyed lots of Christmas crafts. We have made Christmas cards, baubles and calendars. We learnt our lines to perform our Nativity and learnt about the birth of Jesus in R.E. Both Acorns and Oak have enjoyed having Little Movers as our PE lessons. We love learning new dances and playing games. We have also had football sessions this half term where we have learnt many new skills and played lots of fun team games. All of the children have loved our Dough Disco and wiggle squiggle sessions to strengthen our fine and gross motor skills. We have had a fabulous half term!

Key Stage 1

Autumn 2 Review – Deadly Dinosaurs

The children in Beech class have loved the deadly dinosaurs topic. We have researched in books and on the internet about different dinosaurs, their habitat and diet. The children have used the words herbivore, carnivore and omnivore as well as living, dead and never been alive throughout the half term and can confidently talk about what each means.

One of the highlights of the term was learning about Mary Anning and fossils. They loved acting out how fossils are formed and were able to investigate things they could see within the fossil to help them identify what it was originally.

To end the topic the children will be using clay to create a dinosaur inspired art piece that they have loved.

Key Stage 2

Autumn 2 Review – Feel the force

What a busy and action-packed term this was for Willow and Chestnut. The children thoroughly enjoyed the science focus to the term, learning about air resistance, water upthrust, gravity, magnets and friction through a variety of experiments and investigations in the classroom, and particularly enjoyed making their own origami boats to assist with their water upthrust investigations.

In Literacy, we were immersing ourselves further in our small steps English profession. They wrote non-chronological reports relating to their forces work and developed their skills in characterisation by describing an imaginary scientist.

At the start of the term, we had an interfaith week focussing on Sikhism. It was great having the sessions supported with a dance workshop, food tasting, henna art and a visit from the North Sikh Service. We were especially proud of how well they learnt and performed their lines and song lyrics for the Bethlehem Bake-off Christmas performance, considering this was their first time 'post Covid' performing to a live audience, they all found their loud clear voices and were fantastic.

It has to be said, that their highlight of the term would no doubt be the trip to the Sunderland Glass Centre, the glass tiles they created were wonderful and the glass blowing demonstrations and experiments certainly captured their interests and enhanced their learning.



OPERATION ENCOMPASS INFORMATION

The original initiative was aimed at supporting children who are affected by domestic abuse. The next part of the project will help all children to learn about friendships, relationships, emotions and rules so that they can live and work together safely.

<u>Operation Endeavour</u> - This is an innovative project in which schools and colleges in Northumberland are participating, and which is run in partnership with Northumberland County Council and Northumbria Police.

Operation Endeavour commenced in November 2018, aims to support children and young people who go missing from home. Children who go missing from home are at risk of significant harm and they may be vulnerable to sexual exploitation, violent crime, gang exploitation, or to drug and alcohol misuse.

As a result, following any report of a child going missing to the Police, the Police will make contact with Children's Social Care who will then communicate relevant and necessary information to nominated school staff.

Each school has members of staff (key adults) who have been fully trained in liaising with the Police and Children's Social Care when required, and will ensure that the necessary support is made available to the child or young person following their return.

I believe that this project demonstrates our school's commitment to working in partnership to safeguard and protect children, and to providing the best possible care and support for our pupils.
