#### SCHOOL CLOSED

FRI 21<sup>st</sup> Jan- apologies for any inconvenience today. We have had to close the school today due to NO heating, luckily our facilities manager lives in the village so we were able to sort an engineer to come out asap. We will keep you updated. Thankyou

#### **COVID OUT BREAK UPDATE**

We still have over 10% of the school with positive cases but as their isolation periods end and attendance improves then we hope to lift our restrictions as advised by NCC

Until then staff are still wearing masks around school and we continue to encourage mask wearing by all visitors including parents on school site. We remain in bubbles with no year groups mixing throughout the day No clubs apart from Breakfast club continues on separate tables

We still request 2 negative lateral flow test results for your child to return to school before the end of any isolation period.

With 4 weeks left until half term we hope that we will resume normal service by then and thankyou for helping us reduce the transmission.

Risk Assessment and Outbreak Plan- (a copy of which is on the school website)

An update for all education and childcare settings following the Prime Minister's announcement of the end of Plan B. The Prime Minister announced that all Plan B measures will be removed in England, with a full return to Plan A by Thursday 27 January.

In education and childcare settings, this means:

From Thursday 20 January, face coverings are no longer recommended in classrooms and teaching spaces for staff, and pupils and students **in year 7 and above**. They were introduced in classrooms at the start of the spring term as a temporary measure.

From Thursday 27 January, face coverings are no longer recommended in communal areas for staff, and pupils and students in year 7 and above.

This decision comes in response to national infection data showing the prevalence of COVID-19 to be on a downward trajectory. Whilst there are some groups where cases are likely to continue rising, it is likely that the Omicron wave has now peaked nationally. There remains significant pressure on the NHS but hospital admissions have stabilised, and the number of patients in Intensive Care Units (ICU) remain low and are falling.

This means it is right we remove the most stringent restrictions around wearing face coverings from education, but the virus is still with us, and continuing with proportionate protective measures remains vital to protect education.

Local directors of public health are able to recommend the use of face coverings in communal areas, across their area only, where DfE and public health experts judge the measure to be proportionate due to specific health concerns. This is a temporary measure. Directors of public health will continue to advise individual settings experiencing outbreaks. Any local introduction of face coverings will be subject to routine review and removed at the earliest opportunity.

We have updated the guidance for schools, further education settings, special schools and out-of-school settings to reflect these changes.



## **OPERATION ENCOMPASS INFORMATION**

The original initiative was aimed at supporting children who are affected by domestic abuse. The next part of the project will help all children to learn about friendships, relationships, emotions and rules so that they can live and work together safely.

<u>Operation Endeavour</u>- This is an innovative project in which schools and colleges in Northumberland are participating, and which is run in partnership with Northumberland County Council and Northumbria Police.

Operation Endeavour commenced in November 2018, aims to support children and young people who go missing from home. Children who go missing from home are at risk of significant harm and they may be vulnerable to sexual exploitation, violent crime, gang exploitation, or to drug and alcohol misuse.

As a result, following any report of a child going missing to the Police, the Police will make contact with Children's Social Care who will then communicate relevant and necessary information to nominated school staff.

Each school has members of staff (key adults) who have been fully trained in liaising with the Police and Children's Social Care when required, and will ensure that the necessary support is made available to the child or young person following their return.

I believe that this project demonstrates our school's commitment to working in partnership to safeguard and protect children, and to providing the best possible care and support for our pupils.
