Topic Reviews

EYFS- Spring 2 People Who Help Us

This half term we have learnt lots about the emergency services and people who help us. Out highlight was having Mr Tait in to visit. He talked about his job as a paramedic, we got to try on the uniform and check our heart rates. We even got to go inside the ambulance. We know why emergency vehicles have sirens and lights. We also learnt how to keep our teeth clean and why it is important. We learnt all about fire-fighters and their job in the past compared to the present. We then created a fire engine for our role play area and acted out the things we have learnt.

We continued having Little Movers as our PE lessons. We love learning new dances and playing games. All of the children have loved our dough disco and wiggle squiggle sessions to strengthen our fine motor skills

We have enjoyed learning the true meaning behind Easter and creating our own Easter cards. We have had a wonderful half term!

















Elm and Beech Class Summary – Land Ahoy

We have had a great term of learning increasing our knowledge of science and geography without our thematic learning. The children started by learning about the difference between living, dead and never alive and did lots of practical sorting as well as linking back to their previous learning of what things need to survive and be alive. In Geography they widened their knowledge of just the United Kingdom from last term and learnt the name of the seven continents and five oceans. They researched and recorded facts about them and how they are different, thought about where they would like to visit and plotted routes across the oceans with the help of google maps and understand the influence of the Equator on the world's climate. Following this back in Science they considered living things that you find in the ocean, how rubbish and pollution has an impact on their habitat. They made fab jelly fish aquariums in bottles and considered the variety of living things in oceans and at the beach. Finally they started to think about food chains and how this links back to the MRS GREN aspect of nutrition.

Elsewhere in the curriculum they listened to the story 'Somebody Swallowed Stanley' and innovated the story in their English. Year 2 also studied and wrote their own postcards using a model text, which Year 1 will be doing after Easter. In RE the children started by considering the importance of Shrove Tuesday to Christians and learnt about the events of Holy week such as Palm Sunday, the last Supper and Good Friday. It was brilliant to conclude our term singing all our songs to parents in the hall again.

Willow Class- Wonderful Water World

We have been fully immersed into the water world in Willow class. During our topic based lessons we have: learnt about the water cycle, discovered the journey and stages of a river and found out about water wheels and created our own!

The highlight of our half term was our brilliant Key Stage 2 river trip, where we followed the River Aln from its source to its mouth. We got to see all of the features we had been learning about in class, such as meanders, tributaries and erosion/deposition. On our visit we completed two different investigations on erosion/deposition and about side of the river is the speediest.

During our English lessons, we have been learning about explanation texts and their features. We finished off our unit of work by writing about the three stages of a river, the upper course, middle course and lower course. Our trip really helped us visualise our writing.

In science we have been learning about bones and muscles in animals and humans. The children did a fantastic piece of writing based on their learning about the human skeleton and could name many of the bones in our body. We also found out why humans and animals need to get nutrition from food.

2 Year Old Provision Information for parents:

Free education and childcare for 2-year-olds

Your 2-year-old can get free childcare if you live in England and get one of the following benefits:

- · Income Support
- income-based Jobseeker's Allowance (JSA)
- income-related Employment and Support Allowance (ESA)
- Universal Credit, and your household income is £15,400 a year or less after tax, not including benefit payments
- child tax credits, and your household income is £16,190 a year or less before tax
- · the guaranteed element of Pension Credit
- the Working Tax Credit 4-week run on (the payment you get when you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit)

2-year-olds can also get free childcare if they:

- · are looked after by a local authority
- have a statement of <u>special education needs (SEN)</u> or an education, health and care (EHC) plan
- get Disability Living Allowance
- have left care under an adoption order, special guardianship order or a child arrangements order

You may have to pay for extra costs like meals, nappies or trips.

Contact your childcare provider or local council to find out more.

OPERATION ENCOMPASS INFORMATION

The original initiative was aimed at supporting children who are affected by domestic abuse. The next part of the project will help all children to learn about friendships, relationships, emotions and rules so that they can live and work together safely.

<u>Operation Endeavour</u>- This is an innovative project in which schools and colleges in Northumberland are participating, and which is run in partnership with Northumberland County Council and Northumbria Police.

Operation Endeavour commenced in November 2018, aims to support children and young people who go missing from home. Children who go missing from home are at risk of significant harm and they may be vulnerable to sexual exploitation, violent crime, gang exploitation, or to drug and alcohol misuse.

As a result, following any report of a child going missing to the Police, the Police will make contact with Children's Social Care who will then communicate relevant and necessary information to nominated school staff.

Each school has members of staff (key adults) who have been fully trained in liaising with the Police and Children's Social Care when required, and will ensure that the necessary support is made available to the child or young person following their return.

I believe that this project demonstrates our school's commitment to working in partnership to safeguard and protect children, and to providing the best possible care and support for our pupils.
