Summer Half Term (2)

Numeracy;

Year 3 - We will be learning fractions and Geometry this half term. As well as building our varied fluency skills, we will be developing our skills in problem solving and reasoning.

Year 4 - This half term, we will be learning about fractions and decimals and moving onto money. We will be developing our problem solving and reasoning skills alongside our varied fluency skills.


PE - Games

In preparation for Sports Day, the children will be learning and practising a range of athletic style sports and activities as well as developing their football skills with our coach.



Science - Materials, planting

Our big theme this term is Romans as part of the 'Travellers Tales' umbrella, which provides a great context for testing our materials for strength and durability both in battle clothing and catapult design.



Additionally, we will be in our Forest Area planting a Roman Herb Garden to use for Roman medicines and even eating Roman food using the Forest School Fire Pit. As well as learning about the difference between weeds and plants and the indicators of plant pollinators now our plants are growing.

Literacy

Reading

During this half term children will read in a variety of situations throughout the week at school in a shared whole class session, in a small group guided session, one to one with an adult and also independently. The children will look at a range of stories during carpet time

Writing

The children will write in the following genres; Persuasive texts: Children will be writing a battle cry to persuade their own village to join them in a battle.

Explanation text: Children will look at examples of explanation texts and create their own. They will focus on sentence structure in target writing, as well as continuing to work through their spellings in a weekly test.

Speaking & Listening

We will taking on the role of a Roman soldier and continuing with our word power words.

ICT - Data logging

Using the chromebooks the children will be learning how to log data and why we use data. They will learn how computers can use special input devices called sensors to monitor the environment. They will also be collecting their own data which they will plot and analyse.

How do different religions support communities?

This term we will be comparing religious lifestyles and looking more closely at Muslim families and events in the lives of Muslims.

PSHE- 'Health and Wellbeing'

Year 3: We will be learning about how to stay safe and what to do in an emergency. We will also be learning about Medication and the importance of not touching them unless told so.

Year 4: We will be learning about how humans grow and change over time, including physical changes in puberty, menstruation and the importance of hygiene during puberty.

Music - Recorders Tuesdays

As part of our Music connections, the children have been learning to play the recorders. Since September, our recorder teacher has been coming into school each week and teaching us. We have learnt lots of rhythms and have started to read music.







Geography / History - The Romans!

Our main theme is learning about the Romans, hence the children will be studying the Roman Empire, the rulers, soldiers, and life about Claudius. There will even be opportunity for the children to recreate their own Roman battle on the school field!





MFL - French -Time

To support with their time telling in maths, the children will also be learning the basic phrases for telling the time in French! This will include the seasons, days of the week, months as well as general times throughout the day.





Art/ DT - Making helmets and catapults
Within the Roman topic, the children will be
using paper Mache to create and decorate
their own Roman Helmets in small groups. They
will be able to use these helmets in their Roman
battle on the field. As well as design, create
and test in the forest their own groups Roman
Catapult.







Homework

<u>Reading</u> - Children will have their books changed each Friday if it has been fully read. Please remember to make a note in the yellow reading diary so that we can keep a record so we can celebrate the children's reading with certificates.

<u>Spellings and Times Tables</u> - Children will be given differentiated spellings to learn for their weekly spelling test on a Friday morning. Please help your child as much as possible learn these words as they will help with their confidence and fluency as both a reader and writer. They will also have a specific times table to focus on within Times Table Rock Stars - the participation so far has been excellent and shows great improvements in the pupils speed.

<u>Maths / English Homework</u> - Children will be given some Maths homework on Mathletics each Friday that needs to be completed by the following Friday morning for class dojo rewards. The maths homework is usually linked to the work they have done that week in Numeracy and should be appropriate for them to complete independently.
