Swimming

After Easter Year 3 and 4 will no longer be attending swimming lessons every Wednesday to reduce costs. They will instead be having a mixture of PE and Forest School sessions. From September 2024 the new Year 3 and 4 will be swimming only for one term January 2025 – Easter 2025 due to school not being able to subsidise the lack of donations received from families during the cost of living crisis.

Primary Update

Mrs Chapman has already met with the current Year 4 parents to provide additional information about their transition to Year 5 in September 2024. Cost of Living Support

On the school website under School Information, then Mental Health, Well Being and Cost of Living Support you will now find links and important phone numbers for all families to be able to access additional support.

Phones on School Site/In Worship etc.

Please could we ask parents and carers to pop their phones in their pockets when children come out of school. They are excited to see you and this is an ideal time to ask them about their day. Please make sure the first thing your child sees is your face, and not your phone. This also applies to in school activities when we ask parents to join us, and family worship on Fridays as we cannot allow parents/carers to be on their phones in the presence of the children for safeguarding reasons. Thank you for your co-operation.

100% Attendance Incentive

We have introduced an incentive for any child achieving 100% attendance. Each half term, anyone with 100% will be entered into a prize draw to win a £50 supermarket voucher. For this half term, the draw will take place the first week back after the Easter holidays. Good luck everyone!

REMINDER - SCHOOL MONEY - MUST BE PREBOOKED/PAID IN ADVANCE

All breakfast club and after school club places, as well as Wraparound Care (Hangout Club) need to be booked in and paid for in advance on Schoolmoney. You need to book your child into the relevant club on the relevant day, just adding money to the account does not book your child in. Payments for swimming can also be made through School Money. Thank you.

Free School Meals (Pupil Premium)

It's simple and easy to see if your child is entitled to free school meals. This is not the same as universal Free School Meals, which every child is entitled to from Reception to Year 2. You will be able to access subsidised educational visits, free milk, subsidised clubs including Breakfast Club, as well as the school receiving £1500 per pupil which supports resources and staff for your child. The number to apply is 0345 600 6400 and they can check using your national insurance number to see if you are eligible. Please help yourself and the school by giving them a ring, thank you!

Nut Allergy reminder/Packed lunches

We have a pupil in school with a nut allergy. For safety purposes we cannot allow any nut-based products on school site including chocolate spread or nut-based products. We also do not allow sweets in packed lunches. Any items that arrive and are identified in school will be removed and sent back home for health and safety reasons. Nut allergies are very serious and even so much as someone in the same room opening a product containing nuts can be enough to trigger a serious reaction. Thank you for your support.

Early Years

Spring 2 Review – People Who Help Us

We also enjoyed hearing about Mountain Rescue especially as it is not something we knew much about before. It was great to see Mr Tate too. He talked about his job as a paramedic and showed us some of his equipment. We have learnt lots of new facts about people who help us including why emergency vehicles have sirens and lights.

We have continued having Little Movers as our PE lessons. We love learning new dances and playing games. All of the children have loved our dough disco and wiggle squiggle sessions to strengthen our fine motor skills. Key Stage 1

Spring 2 Review - Lands Ahoy!

Despite the atrocious weather at times we managed to get out on our great trip, following the river Aln from its source in the Cheviot Hills of Alnham through Whittingham and Alnwick to its delta at Alnmouth. It was a busy, action packed day but provided lots of opportunities to consolidate all our learning about the features of rivers and how they have a crucial role in the water cycle.

Subsequently, throughout the term the children learnt lots about staying safe online during our internet safety day, raised impressive amounts of money following their sports relief activities, represented the school brilliantly at the opera event in Newcastle and best of all had lots of great fun dressing up as part of World Book Day. In the final week, despite feeling exhausted from the river trip action the children performed an excellent Easter service and consolidated all their learning about skeletons and muscles ready for next terms science themed topic.



OPERATION ENCOMPASS INFORMATION

The original initiative was aimed at supporting children who are affected by domestic abuse. The next part of the project will help all children to learn about friendships, relationships, emotions and rules so that they can live and work together safely.

<u>Operation Endeavour</u> - This is an innovative project in which schools and colleges in Northumberland are participating, and which is run in partnership with Northumberland County Council and Northumbria Police.

Operation Endeavour commenced in November 2018, aims to support children and young people who go missing from home. Children who go missing from home are at risk of significant harm and they may be vulnerable to sexual exploitation, violent crime, gang exploitation, or to drug and alcohol misuse.

As a result, following any report of a child going missing to the Police, the Police will make contact with Children's Social Care who will then communicate relevant and necessary information to nominated school staff.

Each school has members of staff (key adults) who have been fully trained in liaising with the Police and Children's Social Care when required, and will ensure that the necessary support is made available to the child or young person following their return.

I believe that this project demonstrates our school's commitment to working in partnership to safeguard and protect children, and to providing the best possible care and support for our pupils.
