

Pupil Premium Report 2013-14

School is allocated, by the government, a sum of money each year to address the current underlying inequalities between children eligible for free school meals and their wealthier peers.

In 2013-14, this amount was £900 for each child eligible for Free School Meals (FSM) or in the care of the local authority (LAC) with an additional £300 for each child with a parent in the Armed Services.

In 2013/14 academic year Grange View C.E. First school received £21400.

Number of pupils and pupil premium grant (PPG) received:

Total number of pupils on roll 109(including nursery)

Total number of pupils eligible for PPG is 17 children

Amount of PPG received per pupil £900 per children on free school meals, £300 per child who's family are in the Forces and £1900 for Looked after children.

Principles

- We strive to ensure that teaching and learning opportunities meet the needs of all of our pupils.
- We ensure that appropriate provision is made for pupils who belong to vulnerable groups, this includes ensuring that the needs of socially disadvantaged pupils are adequately assessed and addressed.
- In making provision for socially disadvantaged pupils, we recognise that not all pupils who receive free school meals will be socially disadvantaged.
- We also recognise that not all pupils who are socially disadvantaged are registered or qualify for free school meals, these children still need support.
- Pupil premium funding will be allocated following a needs analysis which will identify priority classes, groups or individuals.
- Providing small group work with experienced teaching assistant focused on overcoming gaps in learning, eg booster groups
- Intervention strategies eg Talk Boost RWT, precision teaching, Numericon, Clever Fingers, Social stories, 1-1 / 1-2 / 1-3 support
- Additional teaching and learning opportunities at lunchtimes and after school eg homework club, other after school provision
- Teaching assistant support to raise attainment in Y1/2 in phonics and reading - creating smaller ability based groups in RWT.
- All our work through the pupil premium will be aimed at accelerating expected progress.

How does the school spend this Pupil Premium allocation?

The Head Teacher and the Governing Body decide how to spend the Pupil Premium.

The PPG will be used as follows:

- 1.To fund additional adult support to reduce the pupil: adult ratio and therefore, improving the level of support for our learners;
- 2.To provide flexible intervention programmes for underachieving pupils and those with SEN (Special Educational Needs);
- 3.To fund additional pastoral support to promote good attendance and provide a targeted level of support to some of our most vulnerable children so they can make the progress expected of them;
- 4.To provide one-to-one tuition/ support;
- 5.To subsidise educational visits and residential trips, for example by funding transport or board and lodgings. For some children this has a huge impact on their self-esteem and confidence
- 6.To subsidise breakfast clubs and after school clubs to enhance learning across the curriculum

Impact 2013/14:

Year 1 (21 children) -Phonics Test -85.7% of children passed the test- this is higher than National average of 62% (2013)

- 87.5% of girls passed the test, 80% of boys
- 40% of FSM children passed (2out of 5 children) and 76% of Non FSM children passed

From Year 2 to Year 4 children have made 9.04APS in reading, 8.94APS in Writing and 7.93APS in Maths. This shows good progress and results(2013) are higher than county average. FSM children 7.0 reading and 6.0 maths results are broadly in line with 2013 LA results . Writing 9.0 is above 2013 LA results .

Although a gap has remained, FSM pupils made 6+APS points progress in Reading, writing and maths. Pupil premium children in Yr1-4 are a target for the school this year in Reading, writing and Maths.
