## Useful words

**Continent** – An area of land. Earth has 7 continents.

**Ocean**- A huge body of salt water.

**Food chain**- What is eaten by an animal and what they are eaten by.

**Habitat**- A home for an animal or a plant.

**Coast**- Where the land meets the sea.

**Globe** – A model of the earth. We can use maps and images but a globe is the same shape as the earth.

**Atlas**- A book that contains many different maps about the world.
