
Numeracy;

Our key focus this half term - Children will be partitioning and rounding numbers. They will be learning to order, sequence and compare large numbers. As part of our target Numeracy work, the children will be learning the formal written method for column addition as well as practising applying their understanding to answer written number stories. Throughout the week the children will also be using their Nintendo DS's which this term will be based on Brain Academy Training

Science - Evolution and Fossils

Our big theme this term is the stone age which focuses on the new curriculum requirements of pre history, fossils and how there are many wonders on our doorstep! As part of our science topic we will be finding out about evolution and its purpose in survival, as well as studying a range of fossils, shells and dinosaur footprints for how they can teach us about pre history. In the forest we will also be busy pond dipping - categorising and data logging what we find to compare throughout the year and navigating with a compass







History: The Stone Age

Our big theme this term is focused on the stone age, as a result we will be learning lots about this long period of pre history and how primitive but yet inventive the civilisation was. This theme will structure a great deal of our topic learning in all areas of the curriculum.







Geography - map reading, compasses

As part of Geography we are focussing on the local wonders element, using google maps in ICT to study Widdrington as our local area, creating our own model version of the village using an online program and learning compass reading to follow maps in the outdoor area. Additionally we will also learn about geological timelines and how they play a role in learning about pre history.

Literacy

Reading

During this half term children will read in a variety of situations throughout the week at school in a shared whole class session, in a small group guided session, one to one with an adult and also independently. The children will look at a range of stories set in a historical stone age setting, and a variety of information texts.

Writing

The children will write in the following genres; information texts - using the text features to access, record and present facts as well as historical setting stories. The children will be focusing on making their writing descriptive for the reader, creating atmosphere and suspense. Each week the children will have the opportunity to develop their own writing style during a creative 'big writing' session. The children will be given a specific topic focus then given time to create their own piece of extended independent writing.

They will learn to improve their sentence structure, grammar and punctuation as well as continuing to work through their spellings in a weekly test.

Speaking & Listening

Children will encounter a variety of speaking and listening opportunities. Presenting information they have collected to their class and through team building activities.

Music - Singing Tuesdays

As part of our Music connections, all children in Year 3 and 4 will be learning to sing with a vocal expert. Our new tutor comes will high praise and is no doubt going to teach us some fantastic skills which we can use to hopefully to another great performance this year!



PE - Games- Tennis. Willow (Tuesday)

This term we are focussing on net and wall games with a main focus on leading up to a tennis tournament. This will include finding spaces, ball skills and using a racket to develop their forehand skills.





Swimming is taught by qualified swimming coaches at Morpeth Leisure Centre every Wednesday afternoon, the children are always supervised by school staff.

Art/DT - Clay pot making, pottery painting, baking

Children will be busy using the stone age theme to create a wide range of artistic creations. They will be studying and replicating cave paintings, creating hand shadow art and using modeled techniques to create their own clay pottery. We will also be having Rainbow pottery come into school for a special Artsmark driven whole school project - watch this space, it should be fab! As part of our creative sessions the children will also be making their own rock buns and investigating rubbings of trees and leaves in their forest school work.









MFL - French - Moi

As part of their language learning the children will be practising and learning basic skills such as saying numbers, describing themselves and using adjectives in French.







On Tuesday 26th September it is European Languages Day, so we will be celebrating this year with a focus on Turkey. Watch out for more information about the exciting event in school!

<u>PSHE</u> - Relationships

Year 3 will be learning about different types of families, how we can be a good and supportive friend and how a good relationship should make us feel. We will then learn about appropriate touching, rights to personal space and privacy.

In Year 4 they will also be developing their understanding of feelings and defining what a healthy relationship is. They will build skills in collaboration and valuing each others contributions



Throughout this topic children will learn about the Holy Trinity. They will look at the Gospels, baptism and what it means to say Grace. To help them with this they will use the Bible as a reference and use art to inspire them creating their own Trinity art work.

<u>ICT</u> - E safety, ipad apps, google maps

At the start of the term the children will be given a recap on the importance of safety, reporting incidents and staying safe online. Most importantly they will be reminded of keeping their passwords private, prior to having their school 360 accounts re established and them being able to access work online.









To consolidate our stone age work we will be making full use of the ipads and learning how to use a variety of multimedia apps to present facts that they have learnt. Earlier in the term they will be using Google maps to locate and investigate Widdrington and use the different layer features to find things out about its history.

Homework

<u>Reading</u> - Children will be bringing home their home reading books during the week. It would be helpful if you could either write or sign the book to say you have heard them read, it helps us to avoid repeat reading the same pages. Group Reading takes place each week, the children will be given a set number of pages to read for their next weekly session. Please sign their book once they have read them. Additionally the children may bring home a third book that they have taken out of the library on our Friday visit.

<u>Spellings and Times Tables</u> - Children will be given differentiated spellings to learn for their weekly spelling test on a Friday morning. Please help your child as much as possible learn these words as they will help with their confidence and fluency as both a reader and writer.

<u>Maths / English Homework</u> - Children will be given some Maths Homework to complete from Friday afternoon to the following Friday morning. The maths homework is usually linked to the work they have done that week in Numeracy and should be appropriate for them to complete independently. It will be set online and accessed through mathletics, information will be sent home about this and the children will be trained in school on accessing it. In addition, they will have log in details to Times Table Rock Stars which we encourage the children to complete as often as possible to improve their time in completing. At the end of Year 4 it is quite likely that the class will complete the statutpry times table assessment, so being fast and efficient at their answers would be brilliant.
