Wraparound club is still available every day and I have added a new option – so that parents/carers can book children in to Wraparound for an hour after teacher-led after school clubs, hopefully this will make things easier for people who need to use this option. All clubs need to be booked in advance and paid for at time of booking on School Money please. They are available now to book ready for next half term. You need to book your child into the relevant club on the relevant day (please make sure you choose the correct club/day from the dropdown), just adding money to the account does not book your child in.

#### New Penalty Notice Rules from September 2024 - Attendance/Holidays - Update

As you are all aware, The Department for Education issued new rules for Penalty Notices which came into force from September 2024. This was emailed out to all families before the summer, and earlier this term for new families and as a reminder to all.

One of the points families should take note of, is that a Penalty Notice can also be considered when a pupil has been recorded as absent for 10 sessions (5 school days) within a rolling period of 10 school weeks.

### **Reception Admissions Applications**

It is now time to apply for your child to start school, reception class in September 2025.

Children born between 1<sup>st</sup> September 2020 and 31<sup>st</sup> August 2021 should apply. The portal will close on 15<sup>th</sup> January 2025.

#### **Parent Governor Vacancy Reminder**

A vacancy has arisen on the Governing Body of Grange View CE Primary for the appointment of a Parent Governor. All Parent Governors must have children at the school (as parent or carer) and must also be elected by the parents and carers of pupils at the school. The period of office for service as a Parent Governor is 4 years and a Parent Governor would not be obliged to resign from office if his/her child leaves the school, they would be able to remain in office until the expiry of the term of office.

A separate email has been sent home for anyone to express an interest.


















# **Help with Childcare Costs**

The government has introduced lots of ways to claim back a percentage of your childcare costs while using school breakfast and wraparound clubs. ### **Pupil Premium/Free School Meals**

It's simple and easy to see if your child is entitled to free school meals. This is not the same as universal Free School Meals, which every child is entitled to from Reception to Year 2. You will be able to access subsidised educational visits, free milk, subsidised clubs including Breakfast Club, as well as the school receiving £1500 per pupil which supports resources and staff for your child. The number to apply is 0345 600 6400 and they can check using your national insurance number to see if you are eligible. Please help yourself and the school by giving them a ring, thank you!

### **Breakfast Club/Wraparound Costs**

Following guidance from the Department for Education our Breakfast Club will run from 7:45am from September at a cost of £2.00 for the session.

Wraparound Club will run from 3:15pm until 5:30pm as this was the most requested finishing time from our parent survey, although 6pm will be available if requested, as long as there is more than one pupil to make it viable. Costs for Wraparound will be £5.00 for 3:15pm – 4:15pm or £10.00 for £3:15pm – 5:30pm. 5:30pm – 6:00pm on request would be an additional £2.50.

#### **100% Attendance Incentive**

We have introduced an incentive for any child achieving 100% attendance. Each half term, anyone with 100% will be entered into a prize draw to win a £50 supermarket voucher. The draw for this half term will take place the first week back after Christmas. Good luck everyone.

#### **Emergency Contacts/Up to Date Information**

For safeguarding purposes, we should have 2 emergency contact telephone numbers for all pupils in school. We also need current contact emails/addresses for all parents in school. Please make sure your information is up to date with the office if anything has changed recently, thank you.

## Is my child well enough for school?

# **Nut Allergy reminder/Packed lunches/Grapes**

We have a pupil in school with a nut allergy. For safety purposes we cannot allow any nut-based products on school site including chocolate spread or nut-based products. We also do not allow sweets in packed lunches. Any items that arrive and are identified in school will be removed and sent back home for health and safety reasons. Nut allergies are very serious and even so much as someone in the same room opening a product containing nuts can be enough to trigger a serious reaction. Can we please also remind parents and carers to please cut any grapes (lengthways) that are sent in, as these are a choke hazard when whole. Sweets and chocolate bars are also unsuitable to be included in packed lunches. Thank you for your support.

# **TOPIC REVIEWS**

#### **Early Years**

Autumn 2 Review - Celebrations

Our topic this half term has been a world of celebrations. We have enjoyed learning about bonfire night; creating our own firework artwork. We have also learnt all about the festival of Diwali and used clay to make our own Diya lamps. We then painted them and added glitter.

We all created poppies for Remembrance Day and learnt all about Buddhism for Interfaith Week. We also talked about our birthdays and looked at how we celebrate our special days. We commented on how we have all changed since we were babies.

We have enjoyed writing letters to Santa in our Christmas post office and enjoyed lots of Christmas crafts. We have made Christmas cards, baubles and calendars. We learnt our songs and lines to perform our Nativity and learnt about the birth of Jesus in R.E.

We have had a fabulous half term!

## Key Stage 1

Autumn 2 Review - Deadly Dinosaurs

We have had an action packed half term learning all about dinosaurs. We enjoyed learning about herbivores, carnivores and omnivores where we learnt about dinosaurs' diets.

We learnt the history of dinosaurs of how they were once alive a long time ago and discovered through fossils by archaeologists.

We thoroughly enjoyed our visit to the Great North Museum: Hancock, where we took part in a fossil workshop and activities and enjoyed exploring the fossils and dinosaur gallery.

After our visit, we learnt about physical features such as the ocean, coast etc... and plotted these on maps. The children have also been grouping/classifying animals based on everything we have learnt this half term.

### Lower Key Stage 2

Autumn 2 Review - Feel the Force

What a busy and action-packed term this was for Willow Class. The children thoroughly enjoyed the science focus to the term, learning about air resistance, water upthrust, gravity, magnets and friction through a variety of experiments and investigations in the classroom, and particularly enjoyed making their own origami boats to assist with their water upthrust investigations.

In Literacy, we were immersing ourselves further in our small steps English progression. They wrote nonchronological reports relating to their forces work and developed their skills in characterisation by describing an imaginary scientist.

At the start of the term, we had an interfaith week focussing on Buddhism. It was great having a chance to embrace lots of art skills as well as develop skills in Tai Chi.

We were especially proud of how well they learnt and performed their lines and song lyrics for the Stable Manners Christmas performance, considering this was their first time taking on numerous roles, they all found their loud clear voices and were fantastic.

It has to be said, that their highlight of the term would no doubt be the trip to the Sunderland Glass Centre, the glass tiles they created were wonderful and the glass blowing demonstrations and experiments certainly captured their interests and enhanced their learning.

















#### **Upper Key Stage 2**

Autumn 2 Review - Tomb Raiders

In UKS2 we have been learning about the Ancient Egyptians this half term. We've looked at Pharaohs, gods and goddesses, how the River Nile helped them to create a successful civilisation and what they did in their free time. We even learnt about mummification by mummifying Barbies in class!

To further their knowledge on Egypt, we learnt about the country within Geography – looking at it through a modern lens.

In Science we looked at pulleys and levers which assisted with our theories on how the Ancient Egyptians built the pyramids.

In computing we have been using the micro:bits and programming them to be sensors, one lesson included creating our own fortune tellers, so when we shook the micro:bits they would randomly choose the answer yes or no to our questions!

In PSHE we have been considering what jobs we would like when we grow up and thinking what qualities and strengths we would need to achieve these goals.

All of this was alongside our brilliant Nativity Stable Manners that we rehearsed every week!

#### **OPERATION ENCOMPASS INFORMATION**

The original initiative was aimed at supporting children who are affected by domestic abuse. The next part of the project will help all children to learn about friendships, relationships, emotions and rules so that they can live and work together safely.

<u>Operation Endeavour</u> - This is an innovative project in which schools and colleges in Northumberland are participating, and which is run in partnership with Northumberland County Council and Northumbria Police.

Operation Endeavour commenced in November 2018, aims to support children and young people who go missing from home. Children who go missing from home are at risk of significant harm and they may be vulnerable to sexual exploitation, violent crime, gang exploitation, or to drug and alcohol misuse.

As a result, following any report of a child going missing to the Police, the Police will make contact with Children's Social Care who will then communicate relevant and necessary information to nominated school staff.

Each school has members of staff (key adults) who have been fully trained in liaising with the Police and Children's Social Care when required, and will ensure that the necessary support is made available to the child or young person following their return.

I believe that this project demonstrates our school's commitment to working in partnership to safeguard and protect children, and to providing the best possible care and support for our pupils.
