## **Coats/Wellies for Forest School**

As always, children will be spending time each week in our forest school area. Some children have come to school this week in their lovely new coats they received for Christmas. However, we would rather they didn't risk ruining their new and/or expensive coats on forest days, and wear coats that they (and you) don't mind getting dirty. Can we please also remind all parents/carers that children should have a pair of wellies in school. Thank you for your cooperation with this.

## **Swimming**

As you all know, in previous years we have taken Years 3 and 4 swimming every Wednesday afternoon for the whole school year. Due to declining parental donations we had to cut this to 2 terms, and then cut it again this year to the Autumn term only. We desperately did not want to do this, but swimming for the Autumn term 2024 cost £3,996.50 in total for the lessons and bus hire. Parental donations only totalled £1,190.00. This left a shortfall of £2,806.50 which had to be made up from the school budget. This is unsustainable for us as a small school as it is taking money away that is already earmarked for other activities and resources/equipment needed in school. Unfortunately, the DFE does not allow us to use our PE funding towards the cost of swimming lessons or transport to swimming.















### Nails/Make Up etc.

A reminder that gel nails/extensions and make up are not allowed in school. Please make sure any child who still has nails on has these removed over the weekend please.

### 100% Attendance Incentive

We have introduced an incentive for any child achieving 100% attendance. Each half term, anyone with 100% will be entered into a prize draw to win a £50 supermarket voucher. The draw for this half term will take place the first week back after February holidays. Good luck everyone.

Wraparound club is still available every day and I have added a new option – so that parents/carers can book children in to Wraparound for an hour after teacher-led after school clubs, hopefully this will make things easier for people who need to use this option. All clubs need to be booked in advance and paid for at time of booking on School Money please. They are available now to book this half term. You need to book your child into the relevant club on the relevant day (please make sure you choose the correct club/day from the dropdown), just adding money to the account does not book your child in.

### New Penalty Notice Rules from September 2024 – Attendance/Holidays - Update

As you are all aware, The Department for Education issued new rules for Penalty Notices which came into force from September 2024. This was emailed out to all families before the summer, and earlier this term for new families and as a reminder to all.

One of the points families should take note of, is that a Penalty Notice can also be considered when a pupil has been recorded as absent for 10 sessions (5 school days) within a rolling period of 10 school weeks.

#### Pupil Premium/Free School Meals

It's simple and easy to see if your child is entitled to free school meals. This is not the same as universal Free School Meals, which every child is entitled to from Reception to Year 2. You will be able to access subsidised educational visits, free milk, subsidised clubs including Breakfast Club, as well as the school receiving £1500 per pupil which supports resources and staff for your child. The number to apply is 0345 600 6400 and they can check using your national insurance number to see if you are eligible. Please help yourself and the school by giving them a ring, thank you!

#### Breakfast Club/Wraparound Costs

Following guidance from the Department for Education our Breakfast Club will run from 7:45am from September at a cost of £2.00 for the session.

Wraparound Club will run from 3:15pm until 5:30pm as this was the most requested finishing time from our parent survey, although 6pm will be available if requested, as long as there is more than one pupil to make it viable. Costs for Wraparound will be  $\pm 5.00$  for 3:15pm - 4:15pm or  $\pm 10.00$  for  $\pm 3:15pm - 5:30pm$ . 5:30pm - 6:00pm on request would be an additional  $\pm 2.50$ .















## **Emergency Contacts/Up to Date Information**

For safeguarding purposes, we should have 2 emergency contact telephone numbers for all pupils in school. We also need current contact emails/addresses for all parents in school. Please make sure your information is up to date with the office if anything has changed recently, thank you.

## Nut Allergy reminder/Packed lunches/Grapes

We have a pupil in school with a nut allergy. For safety purposes we cannot allow any nut-based products on school site including chocolate spread or nut-based products. We also do not allow sweets in packed lunches. Any items that arrive and are identified in school will be removed and sent back home for health and safety reasons. Nut allergies are very serious and even so much as someone in the same room opening a product containing nuts can be enough to trigger a serious reaction. Can we please also remind parents and carers to please cut any grapes (lengthways) that are sent in, as these are a choke hazard when whole. Sweets and chocolate bars are also unsuitable to be included in packed lunches. Thank you for your support.

# **OPERATION ENCOMPASS INFORMATION**

The original initiative was aimed at supporting children who are affected by domestic abuse. The next part of the project will help all children to learn about friendships, relationships, emotions and rules so that they can live and work together safely.

Operation Endeavour - This is an innovative project in which schools and colleges in Northumberland are participating, and which is run in partnership with Northumberland County Council and Northumbria Police.

Operation Endeavour commenced in November 2018, aims to support children and young people who go missing from home. Children who go missing from home are at risk of significant harm and they may be vulnerable to sexual exploitation, violent crime, gang exploitation, or to drug and alcohol misuse.

As a result, following any report of a child going missing to the Police, the Police will make contact with Children's Social Care who will then communicate relevant and necessary information to nominated school staff.

Each school has members of staff (key adults) who have been fully trained in liaising with the Police and Children's Social Care when required, and will ensure that the necessary support is made available to the child or young person following their return.

I believe that this project demonstrates our school's commitment to working in partnership to safeguard and protect children, and to providing the best possible care and support for our pupils.
