Expanding our 2 Year Olds Provision

As you may be aware we currently have a 2 Year Olds provision within our Early Years unit, and have five children at the moment. From September we are hoping to expand this to 10 children. To prepare for this we are looking at buying some new furniture and items to make the area bigger and better. Little ones love to play role play games, dressing up, pretending etc. so we'd also love donations of any items you may have at home that you think we could use to enhance their time in school.

Early Years New Collection Times

Due to our growing numbers in Early Years we are changing pick up arrangements at the end of every day for safety and safeguarding reasons.

Nursery 30 hours children will now need to be collected at 3.05pm from the same doors for dismissal. Reception children will still be dismissed at 3.15pm.

We need this 10 minute gap to allow staff to hand over the children to a known adult safely and smoothly as we have 40 pupils to dismiss.

We are over the moon that numbers are continuing to grow and just need to keep everyone safe. Thank you for your support with this.

Wraparound club is still available every day and I have added a new option – so that parents/carers can book children in to Wraparound for an hour after teacher-led after school clubs, hopefully this will make things easier for people who need to use this option. All clubs need to be booked in advance and paid for at time of booking on School Money please. They are available now to book for next half term. You need to book your child into the relevant club on the relevant day (please make sure you choose the correct club/day from the dropdown), just adding money to account does NOT book your child in.

<u>Uniform</u>

A reminder that shoes/trainers should be all black for school through the week, and any trainers on a PE day. No converse though please as we have had several pupils go over on their ankles while wearing them. Also, please make sure that every single item of your child's uniform has their name inside it. Staff are not responsible for chasing up lost uniform, especially if it does not even have a name in it. Named items can be returned more easily if someone takes the wrong jumper/cardigan home by mistake.

Year 5 Phones

Can you please remind your children in Year 5 that their phone should be turned off and put away in their bags as soon as they enter school site please. No photos/sharing TikToks etc. on school premises. Once they enter the classroom they are handed in to Mrs Timmins to be locked away for safe keeping until the end of the day. *Can we also remind parents/carers of Year 5 pupils with phones that they should be responsible for checking their childs phone at the end of the day and making sure there is no inappropriate content/WhatsApp messages/Snapchats etc.*

100% Attendance Incentive

We have introduced an incentive for any child achieving 100% attendance. Each half term, anyone with 100% will be entered into a prize draw to win a £50 supermarket voucher. New Penalty Notice Rules from September 2024 – Attendance/Holidays - Update

As you are all aware, The Department for Education issued new rules for Penalty Notices which came into force from September 2024. This was emailed out to all families before the summer, and earlier this term for new families and as a reminder to all.

One of the points families should take note of, is that a Penalty Notice can also be considered when a pupil has been recorded as absent for 10 sessions (5 school days) within a rolling period of 10 school weeks.

Parental Responsibility on the Yard/No swearing please!

Can we please remind all parents and carers to be responsible for their children on the yard before the bell goes on a morning. We would also like to remind everyone that there should be no swearing. Little ears hear everything and children love to repeat what they've heard. Thank you for your cooperation with this.

Pupil Premium/Free School Meals

It's simple and easy to see if your child is entitled to free school meals. This is not the same as universal Free School Meals, which every child is entitled to from Reception to Year 2. You will be able to access subsidised educational visits, free milk, subsidised clubs including Breakfast Club, as well as the school receiving £1500 per pupil which supports resources and staff for your child. The number to apply is 0345 600 6400 and they can check using your national insurance number to see if you are eligible. Please help yourself and the school by giving them a ring, thank you!

Breakfast Club/Wraparound Costs

Following guidance from the Department for Education our Breakfast Club will run from 7:45am from September at a cost of £2.00 for the session.

Wraparound Club will run from 3:15pm until 5:30pm as this was the most requested finishing time from our parent survey, although 6pm will be available if requested, as long as there is more than one pupil to make it viable. Costs for Wraparound will be $\pounds 5.00$ for 3:15 pm - 4:15 pm or $\pounds 10.00$ for $\pounds 3:15$ pm - 5:30 pm. 5:30pm – 6:00pm on request would be an additional £2.50.

Help with Childcare Costs

If your child becomes unwell we will ring you and let you know immediately.

















Nut Allergy reminder/Packed lunches/Grapes

We have a pupil in school with a nut allergy. For safety purposes we cannot allow any nut-based products on school site including chocolate spread or nut-based products. We also do not allow sweets in packed lunches. Any items that arrive and are identified in school will be removed and sent back home for health and safety reasons. Nut allergies are very serious and even so much as someone in the same room opening a product containing nuts can be enough to trigger a serious reaction. Can we please also remind parents and carers to please cut any grapes (lengthways) that are sent in, as these are a choke hazard when whole. Sweets and chocolate bars are also unsuitable to be included in packed lunches. Thank you for your support.

Phones on School Site/In Worship etc.

Please could we ask parents and carers to pop their phones in their pockets when children come out of school. They are excited to see you and this is an ideal time to ask them about their day. Please make sure the first thing your child sees is your face, and not your phone. This also applies to in school activities when we ask parents to join us, and family worship on Fridays as we cannot allow parents/carers to be on their phones in the presence of the children for safeguarding reasons. Thank you for your co-operation.

TOPIC REVIEWS

Early Years - Spring 2 - Growth and Change

Our topic this half term has been Growth and Change. We have enjoyed learning about life cycles of caterpillars, chicks and frogs. We have thought about how we grow and change from babies to children. In our Art sessions we have created caterpillar paintings using stampers and used symmetry to make butterfly paintings.

We have begun looking for signs of Spring whilst down at the Forest and have been hunting for minibeasts. We have really enjoyed looking at flowers and trying to draw and paint our own daffodils. We loved making our Mother's Day cards and Easter cards. We also planted some sunflower seeds and have enjoyed watching them grow. What a lovely half term!

Key Stage 1 - Spring 2 - Green Grangers

This half term, we have loved learning all about plants and trees. We firstly learnt the parts of the plants and their functions and then enjoyed dissecting plants to look closely at each part. We also learnt what a seed needs to grow and to stay alive. We then explored seeds and bulbs, looking closely at them and identifying similarities and differences between them.

After that we learnt about the importance of bees and we did a fun experiment to show how pollination works. We enjoyed making a home for the bees which we took down to the forest.

Finally, we learnt how fruit and vegetables grow and identified similarities and differences between them. In Art, we have learnt about Vincent Van Gogh and enjoyed painting our own art work in his style.

Lower Key Stage 2 - Spring 2 – Green Grangers

We have really enjoyed this term's topic, which has been action-packed, covering food chains, rainforest layers, dangers, deforestation, and ways animals communicate. The children have created some fantastic setting descriptions, combining different techniques to paint vivid pictures in the reader's mind.

They also used the text There's a Rang Tang in My Bedroom to explore and innovate in poetry.

In Art, we explored the work of Frida Kahlo and created our own beautiful, tropical-inspired self-portraits. Additionally, we enjoyed exploring various engineering careers to raise the profile of STEM. We were also incredibly proud to send many invention designs to the Primary Engineers competition.

We had a wonderful time on World Book Day, when we welcomed a local author who shared her love of writing, drawing, and nature. Later in the term, we were thrilled to have Katherine Renton join us to launch our Arts Week, which focused on movement.

Best of all, we received feedback from Kelsey Byers, this term's scientist focus, who is a biologist. She was very impressed with the fact files we had written, and we are excited to speak with her over Zoom soon.

Upper Key Stage 2 - Spring 2 – Sparks Might Fly

This half term we have focused on electricity in UKS2. We have learnt the circuit symbols, made circuits and investigated what happens when we alter our circuits in different ways. We transferred this knowledge into our DT work by designing and making lighthouses using 'junk' and then getting them to light up by placing circuits inside!

We spent some time learning about our local heritage site Cragside and its famous owner William Armstrong to discover the influence he had on the world with his hydroelectricity and the innovations within his house. We then visited Cragside to see it all in person!

In PE, Maple class have been learning ceilidh routines as well as learning net and ball games, such as volleyball. It has been a very busy half term, with STEM week and Arts week slotted in as well!

OPERATION ENCOMPASS INFORMATION

The original initiative was aimed at supporting children who are affected by domestic abuse. The next part of the project will help all children to learn about friendships, relationships, emotions and rules so that they can live and work together safely.

Operation Endeavour - This is an innovative project in which schools and colleges in Northumberland are participating, and which is run in partnership with Northumberland County Council and Northumbria Police.

Operation Endeavour commenced in November 2018, aims to support children and young people who go missing from home. Children who go missing from home are at risk of significant harm and they may be vulnerable to sexual exploitation, violent crime, gang exploitation, or to drug and alcohol misuse.

As a result, following any report of a child going missing to the Police, the Police will make contact with Children's Social Care who will then communicate relevant and necessary information to nominated school staff.

Each school has members of staff (key adults) who have been fully trained in liaising with the Police and Children's Social Care when required, and will ensure that the necessary support is made available to the child or young person following their return.

I believe that this project demonstrates our school's commitment to working in partnership to safeguard and protect children, and to providing the best possible care and support for our pupils.
