Wraparound

Due to a severe lack of numbers using Wraparound on a Friday after school and to reduce running/staffing costs we will be changing the hours currently offered. On Fridays only from 6th June Wraparound will now only be offered from 3.15pm- 4.15pm.

These hours are subject to change based on the number of pupils requesting to access Wraparound going forward.

Incidents Outside of School

We are hearing of an increasing number of incidents occurring after school, primarily around the park area. Can we please ask that you monitor your child's whereabouts and behaviour on evenings and weekends to hopefully reduce the number of these things being reported to school.

We cannot be responsible for your children's behaviour outside of school hours.

Anti-Climb Paint

We have had some instances recently where teenagers have been caught trespassing on school site after hours and damaging items in the forest school area. Anti-climb paint has been reapplied to all relevant fences, so if your teen comes home covered in black anti-climb paint you'll know what they've been up to.

School Uniform for September

An email was sent home earlier this term from our supplier, Mapac, urging parents and carers to order their uniform for September as early as possible.

We strongly advise, to ensure uniform is received in time for back to school, that orders are placed online by **Thursday 31st JULY**.

Please note, the last ordering date for free delivery to school is **Friday 4th JULY**. This allows Mapac to send any outstanding orders in our system through to school before School closes for the summer. (Last delivery into School on or around **18th JULY**. Delivery to home / workplace are of course still available).

The Free delivery to school option will then be reinstated for parents to select from **SEPTEMBER**. First delivery into School on or around **MID / END OCTOBER**. So, please get your orders in sooner rather than later at <https://www.mapac.com/education/parents/uniform/grangeviewfirstne615lz>

Wraparound club is still available every day *and I have added a new option – so that parents/carers can book children in to Wraparound for an hour after teacher-led after school clubs, hopefully this will make things easier for people who need to use this option.* All clubs need to be booked **in advance** and paid for at time of booking on School Money please. They are available now to book for next half term. **You need to book your child into the relevant club on the relevant day (please make sure you choose the correct club/day from the dropdown), just adding money to account does NOT book your child in.**

Phonics Screening Year 1

We would urge families of children in Year 1 not to take any holidays week commencing 2nd or 9th June as this is when the Phonics Screening checks will be administered.

School Gates

Can we please remind all Nursery parents that for safeguarding reasons, the school gates should be closed behind you after you collect your children at 11:45am.

Dogs on school site

As you are all aware, Mrs Laskey is obsessed with dogs! Whilst we love to see a puppy in arms and kept under control, unfortunately no dogs are allowed on the school grounds (yard) and must be carried if you absolutely need to bring them to school. Mrs Laskey will still be on puppy alert on a daily basis.

Uniform

A reminder that shoes/trainers should be all black for school through the week, and any trainers on a PE day. No converse though please as we have had several pupils go over on their ankles while wearing them. Also, please make sure that every single item of your child's uniform has their name inside it. Staff are not responsible for chasing up lost uniform, especially if it does not even have a name in it. Named items can be returned more easily if someone takes the wrong jumper/cardigan home by mistake.

Early Years New Collection Times

Due to our growing numbers in Early Years we are changing pick up arrangements at the end of every day for safety and safeguarding reasons.

Nursery 30 hours children will now need to be collected at 3.05pm from the same doors for dismissal.

Reception children will still be dismissed at 3.15pm.

We need this 10 minute gap to allow staff to hand over the children to a known adult safely and smoothly as we have 40 pupils to dismiss.

We are over the moon that numbers are continuing to grow and just need to keep everyone safe.

Year 5 Phones

Can you please remind your children in Year 5 that their phone should be turned off and put away in their bags as soon as they enter school site please. No photos/sharing TikToks etc. on school premises. Once they enter the classroom they are handed in to Mrs Timmins to be locked away for safe keeping until the end of the day. ***Can we also remind parents/carers of Year 5 pupils with phones that they should be responsible for checking their child's phone at the end of the day and making sure there is no inappropriate content/WhatsApp messages/Snapchats etc.***

New Penalty Notice Rules from September 2024 – Attendance/Holidays - Update

As you are all aware, The Department for Education issued new rules for Penalty Notices which came into force from September 2024. This was emailed out to all families before the summer, and earlier this year for new families and as a reminder to all.

One of the points families should take note of, is that a Penalty Notice can also be considered when a pupil has been recorded as absent for 10 sessions (5 school days) within a rolling period of 10 school weeks.

Parking Outside School

Polite Notice - For all parents who use a car to get their children to and from school please DO NOT PARK on the zigzag lines outside the school entrances/exits for the safety of all our families.

Parental Responsibility on the Yard/No swearing please!

Can we please remind all parents and carers to be responsible for their children on the yard before the bell goes on a morning. We would also like to remind everyone that there should be no swearing. Little ears hear everything and children love to repeat what they've heard. Thank you for your cooperation with this.

Pupil Premium/Free School Meals

It's simple and easy to see if your child is entitled to free school meals. This is not the same as universal Free School Meals, which every child is entitled to from Reception to Year 2. You will be able to access subsidised educational visits, free milk, subsidised clubs including Breakfast Club, as well as the school receiving £1500 per pupil which supports resources and staff for your child. The number to apply is 0345 600 6400 and they can check using your national insurance number to see if you are eligible. Please help yourself and the school by giving them a ring, thank you!

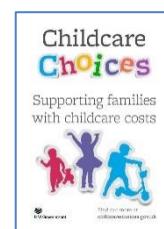
Breakfast Club/Wraparound Costs

Following guidance from the Department for Education our Breakfast Club will run from 7:45am from September at a cost of £2.00 for the session.

Wraparound Club will run from 3:15pm until 5:30pm as this was the most requested finishing time from our parent survey, although 6pm will be available if requested, as long as there is more than one pupil to make it viable. Costs for Wraparound will be £5.00 for 3:15pm – 4:15pm or £10.00 for 3:15pm – 5:30pm. 5:30pm – 6:00pm on request would be an additional £2.50.

Is my child well enough for school?

We want every child to have 100% attendance and anything below 97% will result in our new attendance procedures starting with the support of the Education Welfare officer. <https://www.nhs.uk/live-well/is-my-child-too-ill-for-school/> This link from the NHS may help you decide but we always recommend Calpol and sending them to school. If your child becomes unwell we will ring you and let you know immediately.



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Nut Allergy reminder/Packed lunches/Grapes

We have a pupil in school with a nut allergy. For safety purposes we cannot allow any nut-based products on school site including chocolate spread or nut-based products. We also do not allow sweets in packed lunches. Any items that arrive and are identified in school will be removed and sent back home for health and safety reasons. Nut allergies are very serious and even so much as someone in the same room opening a product containing nuts can be enough to trigger a serious reaction. Can we please also remind parents and carers to please cut any grapes (lengthways) that are sent in, as these are a choke hazard when whole. Sweets and chocolate bars are also unsuitable to be included in packed lunches. Thank you for your support.

Phones on School Site/In Worship etc.

Please could we ask parents and carers to pop their phones in their pockets when children come out of school. They are excited to see you and this is an ideal time to ask them about their day. Please make sure the first thing your child sees is your face, and not your phone. This also applies to in school activities when we ask parents to join us, and family worship on Fridays as we cannot allow parents/carers to be on their phones in the presence of the children for safeguarding reasons. Thank you for your co-operation.

TOPIC REVIEWS

Early Years – Summer 1 – Journey to Space

Our topic this half term has been Space. We have enjoyed learning all about the planets; in particular learning a fact about each one. We have learnt about space, stars and astronauts. Our role play area has been a space station where we have pretended we are blasting off to space!

We have learnt about the life of an astronaut, what they like to eat and what their roles are in space. We even looked at images of the first man on the moon. We imagined what it would be like to live on the moon. In our Art sessions we used a mix of paints to create a marble effect on a planet. We named our new planets and talked about who would live there. During forest school, we have begun looking for signs of Summer and have been hunting for minibeasts.

Key Stage 1 – Summer 1 – Castles

What an action-packed 4 weeks we have had! We began by finding castles on maps and learnt that many were built next to the sea. We learnt about the history of castles and the purpose they served. We then learnt all of the features of a castle and how they helped to defend against enemies.

We thoroughly enjoyed our visit to Warkworth Castle where we learnt all about the Percy family and the history of the castle. We also enjoyed having our own battle, pretending to be enemies or people protecting the castle, planning what weapons we would use and how we would attack or defend.

Lower Key Stage 2 – Summer 1 – Out of this World

Despite being a short term, it has been busy and action packed. The children have learnt during our space topic – studying the formation of shadows as well as how they change position and length depending on the time of the day.

The topic certainly came to life when we went on our visit to the Centre for Life. It was brilliant for illustrating clearly the different solar constellations and planets' appearance in the planetarium as well as finding out about being an astronaut, including the capacity of their space nappy!

In English they considered how to write a newspaper report based upon the first landing on the moon as well as consistently include openers, expanded nouns and similes in their writing. Their transmission home from space writing was brilliant – we were all very impressed!

Upper Key Stage 2 – Summer 1 - Clocks, Chocs and Cheese

This half term in Maple class we have been looking at the country Switzerland. We've learnt about its human and physical geography, finding out about their popular exports, looking at contrasting images from their cities and villages as well as considering the impact of tourism.

Alongside this, we have recapped previous learning on space in our science lessons, including using food to show the order, size and distance between the planets.

Within History, we have looked into who the Ancient Greeks were, linking it to our space learning with their stories about the constellations and their use of sundials.

In computing, we have been comparing paper and computer-based databases, considering the benefits of both.

Our PSHE this half term and into Summer 2 has focused on how we can look after ourselves, including dental health, healthy eating and how to stay safe in the sun.

OPERATION ENCOMPASS INFORMATION

The original initiative was aimed at supporting children who are affected by domestic abuse. The next part of the project will help all children to learn about friendships, relationships, emotions and rules so that they can live and work together safely.

Operation Endeavour - This is an innovative project in which schools and colleges in Northumberland are participating, and which is run in partnership with Northumberland County Council and Northumbria Police.

Operation Endeavour commenced in November 2018, aims to support children and young people who go missing from home. Children who go missing from home are at risk of significant harm and they may be vulnerable to sexual exploitation, violent crime, gang exploitation, or to drug and alcohol misuse.

As a result, following any report of a child going missing to the Police, the Police will make contact with Children's Social Care who will then communicate relevant and necessary information to nominated school staff.

Each school has members of staff (key adults) who have been fully trained in liaising with the Police and Children's Social Care when required, and will ensure that the necessary support is made available to the child or young person following their return.

I believe that this project demonstrates our school's commitment to working in partnership to safeguard and protect children, and to providing the best possible care and support for our pupils.
