**NSPCC Numbers Day – Friday 2<sup>nd</sup> February**

We love maths at Grange View so wanted an opportunity to show you all how much fun we have with numbers. In collaboration with the NSPCC we are inviting parents into school on our Numbers day on Friday 2<sup>nd</sup> February. During the day will be doing lots of fun mastery activities, listening to maths themed stories and children are invited to dress up representing numbers or anything maths related (e.g. shapes, numbers, measurements – please use what you have and be creative – do not go out and buy anything new).

Parents of children in Oak, Beech, Chestnut and Willow are invited into class from 2pm to see what materials we use to help with our maths and play some games. We will also be holding a stay and play for Acorns on the morning of Thursday 15<sup>th</sup> February from 10.45 until 11.45. We look forward to having some mathsy fun together.

**E-scooters**

Although it is legal to own an e-scooter in the UK there are a lot of restrictions around their use. E-scooters are effectively illegal to use on public roads, pavements, in cycle lanes and in pedestrian-only areas and can only be used on private land.

Therefore, travelling to school on them would also technically be illegal. We have been advised that school should not accept e-scooters onto the school site, including storing them in bike sheds. Thank you for your co-operation.

**Turning Primary & Pre-loved Uniform**

As we turn Primary in September 2024, our school logo and uniform will be changing. Of course, we do not expect parents/carers to purchase the new uniform immediately. We will have a transition period where either the old or new uniform can be worn. We do still have some pre-loved uniform in school if anyone needs anything, please contact us with what you require and sizes and we will see if we have it. The new uniform colour has been costed at local supermarkets to make sure it is affordable. Two sweatshirts are available for £5 upwards depending on size. We look forward to sharing our exciting new colour and logo with you soon.

**Safety around School Site**

Please be aware that parents should not be parking in the staff car park and please ensure all school gates are closed/locked behind you for safeguarding purposes.

**100% Attendance Incentive**

## **REMINDER - SCHOOL MONEY – MUST BE PREBOOKED/PAID IN ADVANCE**

All breakfast club and after school club places, as well as Wraparound Care (Hangout Club) need to be booked in and paid for in advance on Schoolmoney. **You need to book your child into the relevant club on the relevant day, just adding money to the account does not book your child in.** Payments for swimming can also be made through School Money. Thank you.

## **Is my child well enough for school?**

We want every child to have 100% attendance and anything below 97% will result in our new attendance procedures starting with the support of the Education Welfare officer.

## **Free School Meals (Pupil Premium)**

It's simple and easy to see if your child is entitled to free school meals. This is not the same as universal Free School Meals, which every child is entitled to from Reception to Year 2. You will be able to access subsidised educational visits, free milk, subsidised clubs including Breakfast Club, as well as the school receiving £1500 per pupil which supports resources and staff for your child.

The number to apply is 0345 600 6400 and they can check using your national insurance number to see if you are eligible. Please help yourself and the school by giving them a ring, thank you!

## **Nut Allergy reminder/Packed lunches**

We have a pupil in school with a nut allergy. For safety purposes we cannot allow any nut-based products on school site including chocolate spread or nut-based products. We also do not allow sweets in packed lunches. Any items that arrive and are identified in school will be removed and sent back home for health and safety reasons. Nut allergies are very serious and even so much as someone in the same room opening a product containing nuts can be enough to trigger a serious reaction. Thank you for your support with this.

### **OPERATION ENCOMPASS INFORMATION**

The original initiative was aimed at supporting children who are affected by domestic abuse. The next part of the project will help all children to learn about friendships, relationships, emotions and rules so that they can live and work together safely.

**Operation Endeavour** - This is an innovative project in which schools and colleges in Northumberland are participating, and which is run in partnership with Northumberland County Council and Northumbria Police.

Operation Endeavour commenced in November 2018, aims to support children and young people who go missing from home. Children who go missing from home are at risk of significant harm and they may be vulnerable to sexual exploitation, violent crime, gang exploitation, or to drug and alcohol misuse.

As a result, following any report of a child going missing to the Police, the Police will make contact with Children's Social Care who will then communicate relevant and necessary information to nominated school staff.

Each school has members of staff (key adults) who have been fully trained in liaising with the Police and Children's Social Care when required, and will ensure that the necessary support is made available to the child or young person following their return.

I believe that this project demonstrates our school's commitment to working in partnership to safeguard and protect children, and to providing the best possible care and support for our pupils.
