Wraparound club is still available every day and I have added a new option – so that parents/carers can book children in to Wraparound for an hour after teacher-led after school clubs, hopefully this will make things easier for people who need to use this option. All clubs need to be booked in advance and paid for at time of booking on School Money please. They are all available to book now. You need to book your child into the relevant club on the relevant day (please make sure you choose the correct club/day from the dropdown), just adding money to account does NOT book your child in.

<u>Uniform</u>

A reminder that shoes/trainers should be all black for school through the week, and any trainers on a PE day. No converse though please as we have had several pupils go over on their ankles while wearing them. Also, please make sure that every single item of your child's uniform has their name inside it. Staff are not responsible for chasing up lost uniform, especially if it does not even have a name in it. Named items can be returned more easily if someone takes the wrong jumper/cardigan home by mistake.

100% Attendance Incentive

We continue with our incentive for any child achieving 100% attendance. Each half term, anyone with 100% will be entered into a prize draw to win a £50 supermarket voucher. The draw for this half term will take place the first Worship back after the October half term holidays. Good luck everyone!

New Penalty Notice Rules from September 2024 - Attendance/Holidays - Update

As you should be aware, The Department for Education issued new rules for Penalty Notices which came into force from September 2024.

One of the points families should take note of, is that a Penalty Notice can also be considered when a pupil has been recorded as absent for 10 sessions (5 school days) within a rolling period of 10 school weeks.

Emergency Contacts/Up to Date Information

For safeguarding purposes, we should have 2 emergency contact telephone numbers for all pupils in school. We also need current contact emails/addresses for all parents in school. Please make sure your information is up to date with the office if anything has changed recently, thank you.

















Pupil Premium/Free School Meals

It's simple and easy to see if your child is entitled to free school meals. This is not the same as universal Free School Meals, which every child is entitled to from Reception to Year 2. You will be able to access subsidised educational visits, free milk, subsidised clubs including Breakfast Club, as well as the school receiving £1500 per pupil which supports resources and staff for your child. The number to apply is 0345 600 6400 and they can check using your national insurance number to see if you are eligible. Please help yourself and the school by giving them a ring, thank you.

Breakfast Club/Wraparound Costs

Following guidance from the Department for Education our Breakfast Club will run from 7:45am at a cost of £2.00 for the session.

Wraparound Club will run from 3:15pm until 5:30pm as this was the most requested finishing time from our parent survey, although 6pm will be available if requested.

Costs for Wraparound will be:

£5.00 for 3:15pm - 4:15pm

£10.00 for £3:15pm - 5:30pm.

5:30pm – 6:00pm on request would be an additional £2.50.

Is my child well enough for school?

We want every child to have 100% attendance and anything below 97% will result in our new attendance procedures starting with the support of the Education Welfare officer. https://www.nhs.uk/live-well/is-my-child-too-ill-for-school/ This link from the NHS may help you decide but we always recommend Calpol and sending them to school. If your child becomes unwell we will ring you and let you know immediately.

Nut Allergy reminder/Packed lunches/Grapes

We have a pupil in school with a nut allergy. For safety purposes we cannot allow any nut-based products on school site including chocolate spread or nut-based products. We also do not allow sweets in packed lunches. Any items that arrive and are identified in school will be removed and sent back home for health and safety reasons. Nut allergies are very serious and even so much as someone in the same room opening a product containing nuts can be enough to trigger a serious reaction. Can we please also remind parents and carers to please cut any grapes (lengthways) that are sent in, as these are a choke hazard when whole. Sweets and chocolate bars are also unsuitable to be included in packed lunches. Thank you for your support.

TOPIC REVIEWS

Early Years - Autumn 1 - All About Me

Early Years have settled in to school very well. We have spent lots of time building friendships and settling in to our routines. Our topic has been 'All About Me'. We have looked at a variety of stories, talked about out features, hobbies, interests and our families. We have used mirrors to draw self-portraits and created skeleton pictures.

We have learnt songs for the Harvest festival and talked about what Harvest means to us. We explored autumn pumpkins, talking about what we could see and how they feel. We have enjoyed having Little Movers as our PE lessons. We love learning new dances and playing games.

We have also spent lots of time in our outdoor areas and in the forest looking for signs of autumn and creating pictures with what we have found. We used a range of autumn leaves, looking for specific colours and collecting conkers. We have had a fabulous half term!

Key Stage 1 – Autumn 1 – Materials Detective

We have had an action-packed half term, learning all about Materials all around us and their properties. We have explored a variety of materials in school and in our outdoor forest area, grouping them based on their properties. We have thoroughly enjoyed carrying out investigations to learn more about materials such as exploring objects that can change shape and if they are waterproof.

We have learnt that some materials are natural and others are man-made. We then enjoyed making a home for the 4 the little pig in the forest area, thinking about what material would be best.

In Geography, we have been looking at aerial view images and drawing our own aerial view pictures. We then looked at our school from aerial view and discussed what we can see.

Lower Key Stage 2 – Autumn 1 – Savage Stone Age

What a brilliant start to the year we have had in Willow Class, from day one it has been action packed getting emerged in our visit to the prehistoric Stone Age. We thoroughly loved the English hook texts Stone Age Boy and Ug, creating great dialogue writing and forming a foundation of knowledge for our topic learning. The children learnt lots of fascinating and interesting facts, building upon their knowledge of fossils from KS1 as well as how Neolithic people survived.

In addition to learning lots of historical facts, the children had lots of creative opportunities: acting out how they moved large boulder stones using logs, developing observational drawing skills for fossils and using charcoal as a art resource - best of all, transforming the classroom into a stone age cave to use their fingers and paints to recreate iconic cave animal art. We are looking forward to our visit to the Hancock Museum on the first day back to consolidate all our learning next term.

Upper Key Stage 2 – Autumn 1 – In The Beginning

This half term we have learnt about evolution and inheritance. We looked at how traits are passed down from parents to their offspring and looked at examples of these. We spoke about natural selection, which involved a fun lesson tools which were meant to be bird 'beaks', looking at how birds' beaks are shaped for the foods they eat.

We also learned about how fossils gave scientists the evidence they needed for these theories. The scientist we focused on was Charles Darwin and in our history lessons, we looked at the voyage he took and the discoveries he made on this. We found out about his theories and why is still considered to be an important scientist today.

In computing, we looked at how computers communicate with each other and even found out how to work on documents with other people in the class when on different computers.

In our PSHE unit, we were learning about personal identity, what makes each person unique and also looked at what prejudice is.










Stars of the week

OPERATION ENCOMPASS INFORMATION

The original initiative was aimed at supporting children who are affected by domestic abuse. The next part of the project will help all children to learn about friendships, relationships, emotions and rules so that they can live and work together safely.

<u>Operation Endeavour</u> - This is an innovative project in which schools and colleges in Northumberland are participating, and which is run in partnership with Northumberland County Council and Northumbria Police.

Operation Endeavour commenced in November 2018, aims to support children and young people who go missing from home. Children who go missing from home are at risk of significant harm and they may be vulnerable to sexual exploitation, violent crime, gang exploitation, or to drug and alcohol misuse.

As a result, following any report of a child going missing to the Police, the Police will make contact with Children's Social Care who will then communicate relevant and necessary information to nominated school staff.

Each school has members of staff (key adults) who have been fully trained in liaising with the Police and Children's Social Care when required, and will ensure that the necessary support is made available to the child or young person following their return.

I believe that this project demonstrates our school's commitment to working in partnership to safeguard and protect children, and to providing the best possible care and support for our pupils.
